I've never had a really bad fall before, but I can remember the one at **Wellington very well** as I wasn't knocked out! It was pretty painful. I landed with straight arms and both elbows snapped back the wrong way and shattered. Thankfully I was wearing my Airowear body protector so I didn't have any injuries to my torso, despite the horse

landing on me - luckily he's fine.

It's rather inconvenient having no arms at the moment and I'm very reliant on the people around me, especially my wife who deserves a medal for looking after me so well, despite being six months pregnant and having our one-year-old daughter to contend with, too! I'm trying to stay fit and I'm looking forward to getting back on board.

I always look forward to riding at the big events. I'm lucky enough to have completed Badminton eight times, and have some truly memorable moments from Burghley. In 2007 Bruce Davison (former American rider) and I were the only two to jump double clears, and we were the oldest and youngest competitors in the field!
